Debra Diamond is Curator of South and Southeast Asian art at the Freer and Sackler galleries. A specialist in Indian court painting and the visual culture of yoga, her most recent exhibition, *Yoga: The Art of Transformation* (2013) received First Place Awards of Excellence for both exhibition and catalogue from the Association of Art Museum curators. In 2008, she was the curator for the acclaimed international exhibition *Garden and Cosmos: The Royal Paintings of Jodhpur*; the exhibition catalog won the 2010 Alfred H. Barr, Jr. award for best museum scholarship and Smithsonian Secretary's research prize. She also coordinated the yearlong *Celebration of India* at the Freer | Sackler, which encompassed two exhibitions and a wide array of public



programs devoted to making south Asian art and culture come alive for diverse audiences.

Ms. Diamond has curated numerous exhibitions at the Sackler galleries, including *Worlds within Worlds: Imperial Paintings from India and Iran (2012); In the Realm of the Buddha* (2010); *Facing East: Portraits from Asia* (2006); *Perspectives: Simryn Gill* (2006); *Autofocus: Raghubir Singh's Way into India* (2003); and the reinstallation of *Arts of the Indian Subcontinent and the Himalayas* at the Freer. She received her Ph.D. in south Asian art history from Columbia University (2000) and has published on Indian and contemporary Asian art.

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
