Rehfuss) the online catalogue *Ceramics in Mainland Southeast Asia: Collections in the Freer Gallery of Art and Arthur M. Sackler Gallery.* Her research on earthenware in India was published as *Temple Potters of Puri* (with Purna Chandra Mishra, 2012).
